
Book Week Scotland: Storytime with Beth McClure Saturday 18 November, 10am at Old Aberdeen Library

Saturday 18 November, 10am at Culter Library


Techfest will deliver an interactive session that will feature examples of maths in motion. Suitable for ages 5-12.
