Book Week Scotland: Storytime with Beth McClure

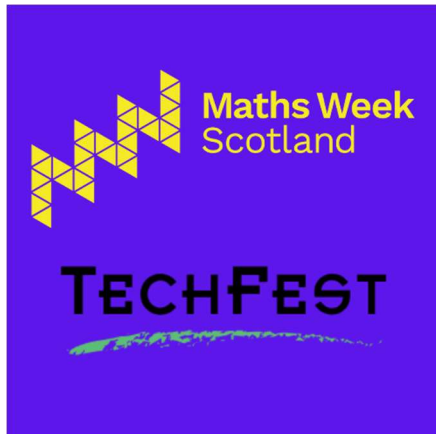

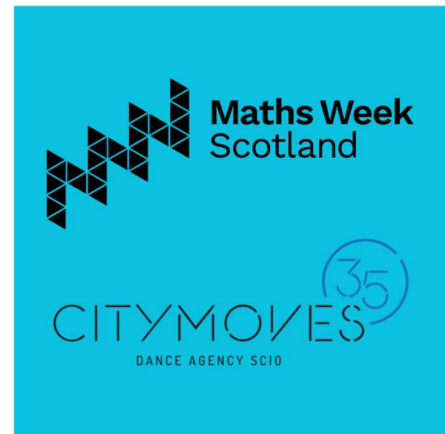
Techfest will deliver an interactive session that will feature examples of maths in motion. Suitable for ages 5-12.

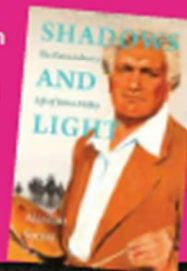
