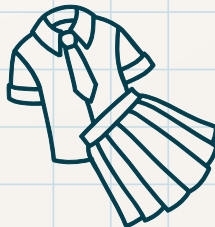
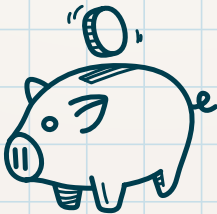




SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

If you are on a low income and have children at school,
you may be entitled to financial support

2026/2027



BEST START FOODS

WHAT

Best Start Foods is a prepaid card that can help you buy healthy foods like milk or fruit.

The amount you get on your prepaid card will change depending on the age of your child. The Best Start Foods payments are:

- **£22.40** every 4 weeks during pregnancy – the payment amount is per pregnancy. This means the payment amount is the same whether you're pregnant with one baby, or if you're having twins or triplets
- **£44.80** every 4 weeks from your child being born up until they're one year old
- **£22.40** every 4 weeks when your child is between the ages of one and 3 years old

WHEN

From start of pregnancy to child's 3rd birthday.



WHO

You qualify if you receive:

- Universal Credit
- Housing Benefit
- Income Support
- Guaranteed Pension Credits
- Income-Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance

There are now no longer any income thresholds for Best Start Foods.

Claim by telephoning 0800 182 2222 or visit www.mygov.scot/best-start

You continue to get credits on the card for 8 weeks if you no longer qualify through UC. If you notify Social Security Scotland that you are entitled through UC again within 12 weeks, you can become entitled to Best Start Foods again without having to make a claim.

If your baby is born early, you will receive the higher amount from birth until 1 year after the due date.

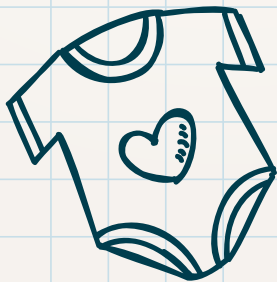
BEST START GRANT: PREGNANCY AND BABY PAYMENT

WHAT

£796.65 to help with the costs of pregnancy or a new baby if you have no other children under 16 living with you; or **£398.35** if you have any other children aged under 16 living with you. There is a **£398.35** supplement if you have a multiple birth.

WHEN

You can get Pregnancy and Baby Payment any time after you have reached the end of the 24th week of pregnancy until the day your baby is 6 months old. If your baby is born before 24 weeks, you can apply from this date up to the day your baby is 6 months old. If you've taken over looking after a child, for example, if you've adopted, you can apply up to the day before the child's first birthday.



WHO

You qualify if you are

- aged under 18 (regardless of income or benefits),
- aged 18 or 19 and a named dependant in someone else's benefit claim because you are still in school or college OR you or your partner are in receipt of:
 - Universal Credit (UC)
 - Income Support
 - Income-Based Jobseeker's Allowance
 - Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance
 - Guaranteed Pension Credits
 - Housing Benefit

You can also apply by phone on **0800 182 2222**, or request a claim form be sent out to you. Claim within six months of the birth even if waiting for a universal credit decision, then contact Social Security Scotland when awarded.

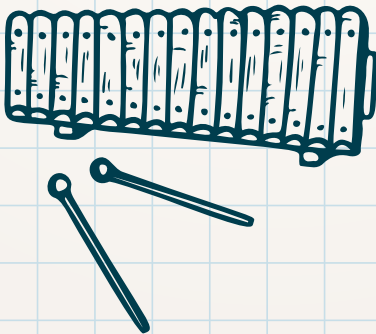
BEST START GRANT: EARLY LEARNING PAYMENT

WHAT

Early Learning Payment is a payment of **£331.95** per child to help with the costs of early learning. You can get the payment when your child is aged between 2 years old and 3 years and 6 months old. To get this payment your child does not need to go to nursery.

WHEN

When your child is aged between 2 years old and 3 years and 6 months old.

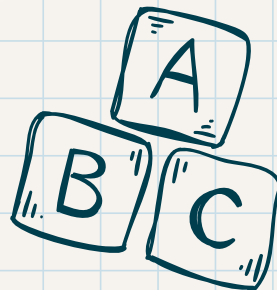


WHO

You qualify if you are:

- aged under 18 (regardless of income or benefits),
- aged 18 or 19 and a named dependant in someone else's benefit claim because you are still in school or college OR you or your partner are in receipt of:
 - Universal Credit (UC)
 - Income Support
 - Income-Based Jobseeker's Allowance
 - Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance
 - Guaranteed Pension Credits
 - Housing Benefit

BEST START GRANT: SCHOOL AGE PAYMENT

WHAT

School Age Payment is a payment of **£331.95** per child. It helps with the costs of preparing for school when your child is first old enough to start primary school.

You can get the payment for multiple children, as long as each child is the right age when you apply.

WHEN

When you need to apply for the School Age Payment depends on when your child was born:

Your child's date of birth	When you can apply
Between 1 March 2021 and 28 February 2022	Between 1 June 2026 and 28 February 2027
Between 1 March 2022 and 28 February 2023	Between 1 March 2027 and 28 February 2028

WHO

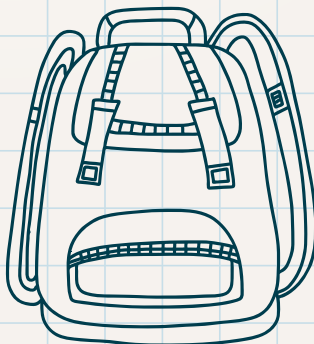
You qualify if you are:

- aged under 18 (regardless of income or benefits),
- aged 18 or 19 and a named dependant in someone else's benefit claim because you are still in school or college OR you or your partner are in receipt of:
 - Universal Credit (UC)
 - Income Support
 - Income-Based Jobseeker's Allowance
 - Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance
 - Guaranteed Pension Credits
 - Housing Benefit

SCOTTISH CHILD PAYMENT

WHAT

£28.20 a week for each eligible child.

WHEN

From birth – up to child's 16th birthday.



WHO

A parent ordinarily resident in Scotland, responsible for a child and entitled to one of the following qualifying benefits:

- Universal Credit
- Guaranteed Pension Credits
- Income Support
- Income-Based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance

ELIGIBLE 2's

WHAT

Free Early Learning and Childcare for 2-year-olds.

WHEN

They accept an Eligible2 Application Forms for processing six weeks prior to child's second birthday.

For any child placement should start a school term after child's second birthday.

Child born between	Start of placement
1 January – 28/29 February	April
1 March – 31 August	August
1 September – 31 December	January

- State Pension Credit
- Support under Part V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit when your household take-home pay, is £885 per month or less.

Or if the child is age 2 or over and is or, since they turned 2 has been (in terms of legal status):

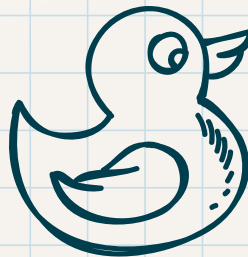
- 'Looked After' by a local council
- The subject of a 'Kinship Care Order'; or
- The subject of a 'Parent Appointed Guardianship Order'; or
- Has a care experienced parent.

WHO

Eligible 2-year-old children are entitled to up to 1140 hours of funded ELC (Early Learning and Childcare), if their family is in receipt of one of the following benefits and allowances:

- Income Support
- Job Seekers Allowance (income based)
- Any income related element of Employment and Support Allowance
- Incapacity or Severe Disablement Allowance



PRIMARY SCHOOL

BEST START GRANT

WHAT

The Best Start Grant School Age Payment is **£331.95** for each child to help with the costs of children starting school. It is up to you what you spend it on, and you don't need to show receipts.

WHEN

When you need to apply for the School Age Payment depends on when your child was born:

Your child's date of birth	When you can apply
Between 1 March 2021 and 28 February 2022	Between 1 June 2026 and 28 February 2027
Between 1 March 2022 and 28 February 2023	Between 1 March 2027 and 28 February 2028

You cannot apply out with these dates.



WHO

You can claim this payment if you are responsible for a school age child (see previous information on application dates) and you or your partner are entitled to one or more of the following benefits listed below:

- Universal Credit
- Child Tax Credit or Working Tax Credit
- Income Support
- Income-Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Housing Benefit
- Guaranteed Pension Credits

You can apply anytime within the **9-month application window**.

If you have become responsible for a child, for instance as a kinship carer, you might qualify for a payment even if a payment has already been made to someone else – as long as you were not that person's partner when they received the grant, and the child is not living with that person.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

WHAT

The School Meals Catering Service provides meals for all schools in the city. The service aims to provide nutritious, well presented meal choices daily, promote the healthier options and actively encourage their uptake and provide a service that meets the highest health and safety standards.

Currently Primary school meals cost **£2.35**. If you qualify for free school meals, you can save approximately **£446.50** per year.

WHEN

From January 2022, all primary school pupils from P1 to P5 presently receive a free school meal.

If a child is in P1 to P5 and the parent/ carer meets the eligibility criteria due to low income, the parent/carer should apply for Free School Meals in order to receive vouchers during the holidays.

WHO

Pupils are eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive one of the following benefits:

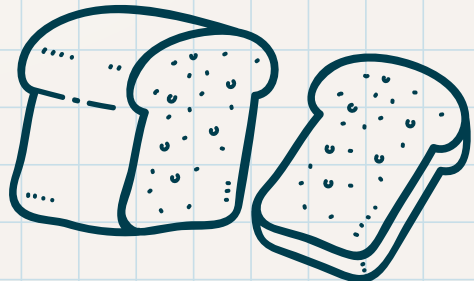
- Pension Credit (Guarantee Credits)
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with a monthly earned income of not more than £995

If you don't meet the conditions for families on a low income, you can still apply for free school meals if you:

- Get the Scottish Child Payment
- Have a child in primary 6 or 7

SCHOOL CLOTHING GRANT

WHAT

We can, in some circumstances provide a grant towards the costs of school clothing and footwear if you receive certain benefits, which can also be used for winter clothing.

The current grant is **£120** towards the costs of essential school clothing. For pupils of statutory school age, the grant is paid to parents/carers; for pupils over statutory school age the grant is paid to the student.

WHEN

You can only apply for children attending school or about to enter Primary 1. If you are an eligible student who receives an Education Maintenance Allowance you can apply for a school clothing grant for yourself.

You can apply for a school clothing grant once per child in any financial year i.e. between 1 April and 31 March.

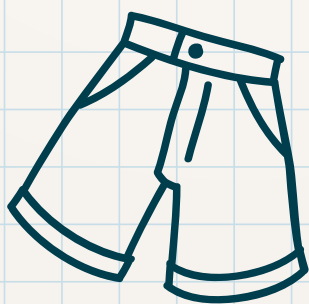
WHO

You can apply for a school clothing grant if you or your family receive any of these benefits:

- Universal Credit and your monthly earned income is not more than £995
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Housing Benefit and/or Council Tax Reduction
- Guaranteed Pension Credits

You can apply for a school clothing grant online. Before you apply online, you will need to set up an account. This is so you can track the progress of your application.

SECONDARY SCHOOL

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

WHAT

The current cost of a secondary school meal is **£2.65** per day. If you qualify for free school meals, you can save approximately **£503.50** per year.

WHEN

To receive free school meals in secondary school you must make an application. There is currently no automatic entitlement to this.

WHO

Pupils are eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive one of the following benefits:

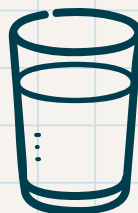
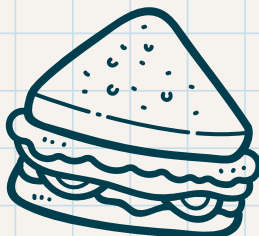
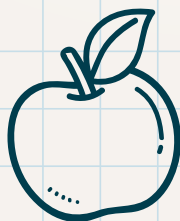
- Universal Credit with a monthly take home pay of less than £995
- Guaranteed Pension Credits
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

If you don't meet the conditions for families on a low income, you can still apply for free school meals if you:

- Have a child in secondary 1 to 3

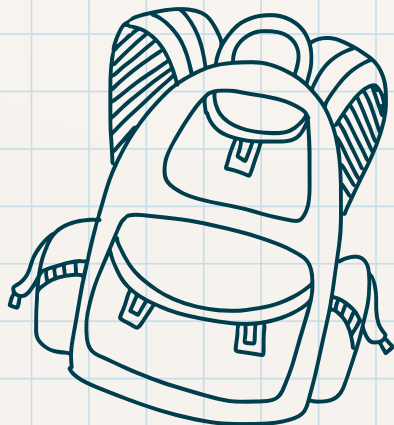

STAYING ON AT SCHOOL

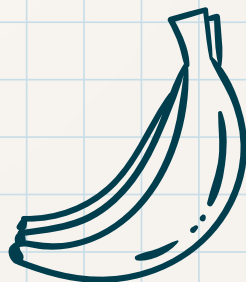
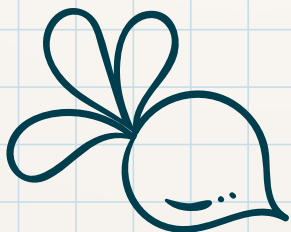
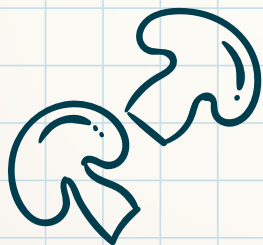
To receive free school meals in secondary school you must make an application. There is currently no automatic entitlement to this.

WHO

- Universal Credit with a monthly take home pay of less than £995
- Guaranteed Pension Credits
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

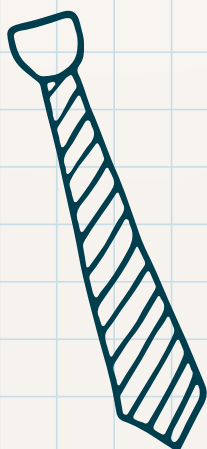

EDUCATION MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCES

WHAT

An Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is a weekly allowance of **£30** paid to the young person during the school year. (During Term Time)

It is paid on a two-weekly basis.

WHEN

An EMA provides financial support for 16–19-year-olds who stay on at school. You should apply as soon as you become eligible as payments may not be backdated.

Students become eligible for an EMA in August if they turn 16 between 1 March and 30 September and in January if they turn 16 between 1 October and end of February. Eligibility is reassessed each academic year.

WHO

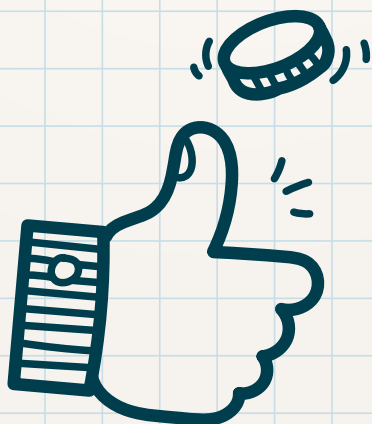
To be eligible for an EMA in 2026/2027 the student must:

- The start date of your EMA will depend on the date of your sixteenth birthday
- Have been born between 1 March 2007 and 28 February 2011

The young person qualifies if your annual household income is:

Household Income	No. of dependent children in Household
£0 - £24,421	1
£0 - £26,884	2+

YOUNG CARERS GRANT

WHAT

The Young Carer Grant is a yearly payment of **£405.10** for young carers in Scotland. How the grant is spent is up to you, there is no need to provide receipts.

WHEN

To be able to get a Young Carer Grant, you must:

- Be 16, 17 or 18 years old
- Have been caring for 1,2 or 3 people for an average of 16 hours per week for at least the last 3 months.

If you care for more than one person, you can combine the hours of the people you care for to average 16 hours per week.

WHO

You can get a Young Carer Grant if all of these apply:

- You're 16, 17 or 18 years old
- You've been caring for one or more people for around 16 hours per week for the last 3 months
- The person or people you care for get certain benefits
- You're not being paid to care for someone you will use in your application as part of your job
- You're not helping care for the people you apply for as a volunteer, for example as part of a care group or charity
- You're not already getting Carer's Allowance from the Department for Work and Pensions

STATE BENEFITS/ALLOWANCES

WHAT

If your young person stays on at school after turning 16, you may still be able to receive Child Benefit and the Child Element of Universal Credit (UC).

These payments can be worth:
£27.05 per week for Child Benefit

Up to **£351.88** per month for your eldest or only child (if born before April 2017), or £303.94 per month for other children through the Universal Credit Child Element.

WHEN

Both benefits can continue while your young person is in approved education or training, which must meet the following rules:

- It's non-advanced education (for example, studying Highers or below in Scotland).
- It's full-time, meaning at least 12 hours per week of supervised study or instruction.
- The course must start before the young person's 19th birthday.

If these conditions are met:

- Child Benefit can continue until the day before your young person's 20th birthday, or until they leave education or training (whichever comes first).
- Universal Credit can continue for the same period, though the exact end date may differ slightly depending on your UC assessment period.
- If your young person leaves education or training early, Child Benefit usually ends on the next "terminal date" - the last day of February, May, August, or November.

WHO

Payments normally stop when your young person finishes or leaves full-time non-advanced education. However, both can continue if you confirm they are still in education or approved training.

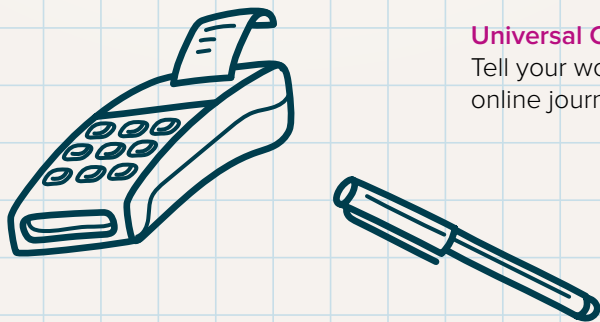

CHILD DISABILITY PAYMENT

WHAT

Child Disability Payment helps with the extra costs a disabled child might have. It is **tax-free** and is made up of a **care component** and a **mobility component**.

You can apply for a child under **16** with a physical or mental disability. You can also apply if the child does **not** have a diagnosis. You can tell Child Disability Payment - mygov.scot about how they are affected and any symptoms they have.



A child's care and mobility needs can include physical or non-physical difficulties such as:

- emotional
- behavioural
- mental
- developmental

WHEN

Children aged **3 months or over** can qualify for the care component. Children aged **3 or over** can qualify for the higher rate mobility component, and children aged **5 or over** can qualify for the lower rate mobility component. If awarded, payments are normally made every **4 weeks in arrears**.

WHO

Component	Rate	Who it may apply to
Care component – Lowest	£30.30 a week	A child aged 3 months or over who needs help for much of the day with bodily functions, or is 16 or older and cannot prepare a cooked meal.
Care component – Middle	£76.70 a week	A child who needs help or supervision throughout the day or night, or gets renal dialysis treatment at least twice a week.
Care component – Highest	£114.60 a week	A child who needs help or supervision throughout both day and night, gets renal dialysis day and night, or has a terminal illness.
Mobility component – Lower	£30.30 a week	A child aged 5 or over who can walk but needs help from another person to move around outdoors.
Mobility component – Higher	£80 a week	A child aged 3 or over who is unable to walk, unable to walk outdoors, whose health would get worse from walking, has no legs or feet, has a severe visual disability, is blind and deaf, has a severe mental disability with severe behavioural difficulties, or has a terminal illness.

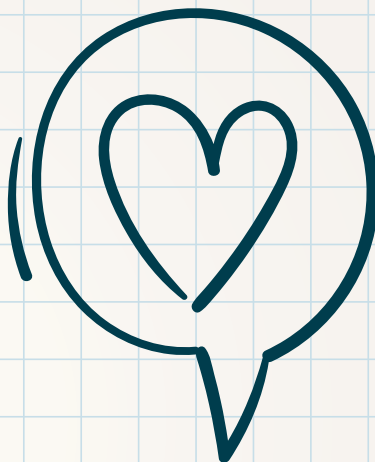

CARER BENEFIT

WHAT

If you provide care for one or more people, you may be able to get financial support through **Carer Support Payment**. If eligible, Carer Support Payment - mygov.scot says Social Security Scotland can award all of the following together:

- **Carer Support Payment**
– up to **£86.45** a week
- **Scottish Carer Supplement**
– **£11.70** a week
- **Carer Additional Person Payment**
– **£10.40** a week for each additional person you care for who gets a qualifying benefit

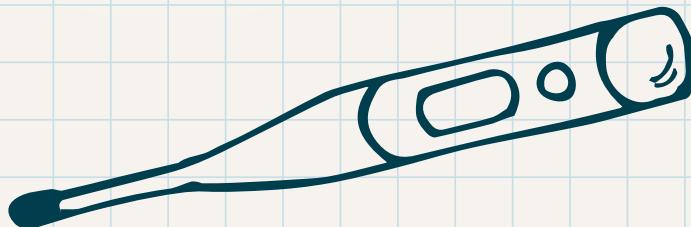
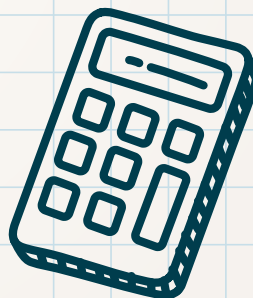


You will usually receive **one payment**, which can include all 3 elements.

WHEN

There is no fixed application window. You should apply when you meet the qualifying conditions for **Carer Support Payment**.

You'll usually be paid **every 4 weeks**, at the end of the 4 weeks, although in some circumstances you can be paid weekly.



WHO

You may be eligible if you live in Scotland and provide care for someone who gets a qualifying benefit. The current booklet wording already says you could get **£86.45** a week if you:

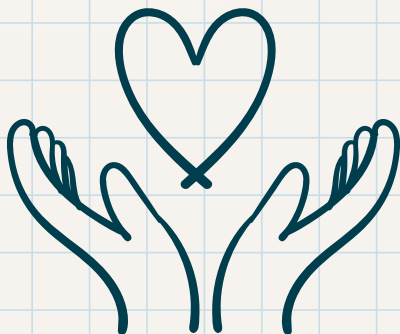
- care for someone at least **35 hours a week**
- get certain benefits
- earn less than **£204 per week**

If you care for more than one person, you may also be able to get **Carer Additional Person Payment** for each additional person you care for who gets a qualifying benefit. You can add additional people later as a change of circumstances.

Applying for **Carer Support Payment** can affect some income-related benefits, including **Universal Credit**. However, the official Scottish guidance says **Scottish Carer Supplement** and **Carer Additional Person Payment** do **not** affect other benefits.

Carer Support Payment	Up to £86.45 a week	The Department for Work and Pensions will reduce the amount you get for any income-related benefits, such as Universal Credit .
Scottish Carer Supplement	£11.70 a week	No effect on other benefits.
Carer Additional Person Payment	£10.40 a week for each additional person you care for	No effect on other benefits.



CHILD WINTER HEATING PAYMENT

Children and young people in Scotland can get the assistance if they're under 19 years old and get one of the following 'qualifying benefits':

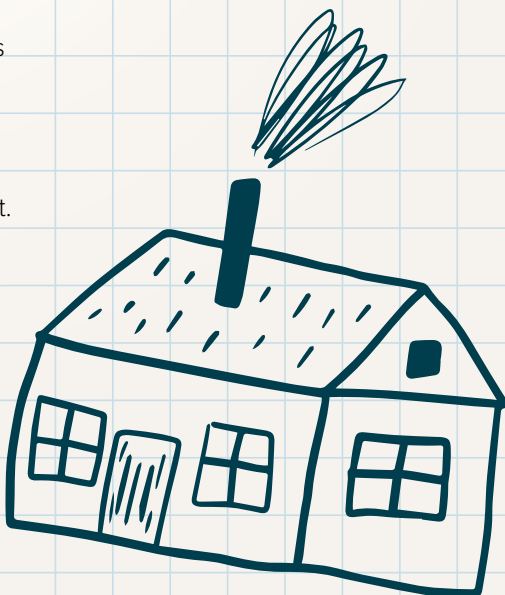
- The highest rate of the care component of Child Disability Payment
- The highest rate of the care component of Disability Living Allowance for children
- The enhanced daily living component of Personal Independence Payment
- The enhanced rate of the daily living component of Adult Disability Payment
- They must be getting this on at least one day in the third full week of September.

This includes if a qualifying benefit is backdated to this period.

If there is more than one child or young person who qualifies in the household, they each get a payment.

Qualifying week for 2025 - Monday 15 September to Sunday 21 September 2025. It's paid once a year. The payment for winter 2026-2027 is **£265.50**.

Eligible children and young people living in Scotland do not need to apply. They'll get their payment automatically.



WHO CAN HELP?

Many families don't get all the financial assistance and benefits they are entitled to. This may be because they are unaware of their entitlement, the rules are complex or because they have been wrongly refused.

If you are on a low income, you may be able to get some help even if you haven't claimed before or if you think you won't qualify.

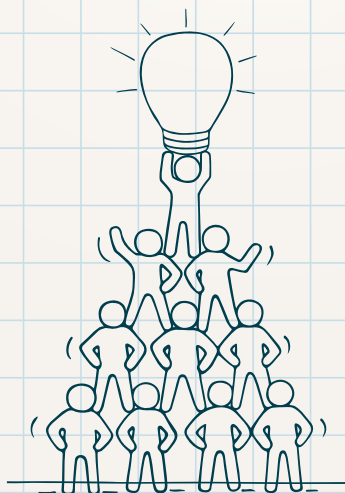
